

## Antonyms II

Description	Children read and identify words that mean the opposite or almost the opposite.
You Need	Antonyms II Word Cards sheet
	Antonyms II Assessment–Class Record form
Why Use It	This quick oral assessment tells you whether children understand the concept of antonym. Once this concept is understood, you can make a continuous list of antonyms, adding to it throughout the year, for children to refer to during word study, reading and writing. Work with children who need help in small groups.
How to Use It	Administer this assessment individually or to the whole class. (Individually test children who do not seem to be responding successfully.)
	Hold up pairs of words, some that are antonyms and some that are not. Ask children to clap or raise their hands when the two words mean the opposite.
	Enter the results on the Class Record.
What to Notice	Child's understanding that there are words that mean the opposite
	Number of words the child can read accurately
	Number of antonym pairs the child can form accurately
	Specific antonyms a child knows
